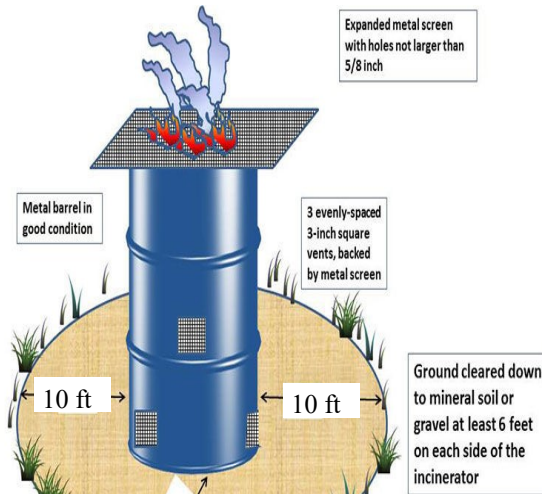


BURNING DEBRIS IN BURN BARRELS

- Burning is allowed from dawn to dusk.
- The following materials are permitted for burn barrels:
 - Paper
 - Small Limbs
 - Dry Leaves/grass clippings

PROHIBITED MATERIALS FOR ALL TYPES OF BURNING:

- Garbage
- Plastics, like foam cups, meat trays and egg containers
- Diapers
- Wire Insulation
- Auto Bodies
- Asphalt
- Waste Oils
- Rubber, including tires
- Dead Animals/Horse Manure/Dog Waste
- Food Service Waste
- Commercial and Industrial Waste
- Petroleum treated material/products



Make sure all openings are covered with screen to prevent embers from escaping and don't use a barrel with rust holes.

BELOW ARE EXAMPLES OF APPROVED CONTAINERS FOR OPEN BURNING. OTHER CONTAINMENT METHODS, SUCH AS BUILT-IN PIT OR FIRE RINGS WITH PROPANE ARE ALSO APPROVED.

BEFORE YOU DO ANY BURNING WITHIN CROOKED RIVER RANCH, YOU MUST CALL THE BURN LINE AT 541-923-4633 TO SEE IF BURNING DEBRIS & CAMPFIRES ARE ALLOWED FOR THAT DAY. ALL BURNING INSIDE OF CROOKED RIVER RANCH REQUIRES A COPY OF THIS PAMPHLET AT THE BURN SITE. THIS ACTS AS YOUR PERMIT.

BURNING SEASON IS DETERMINED BY CURRENT WEATHER & FUEL CONDITIONS. WE WILL NOTIFY THE PUBLIC WHEN YOU ARE ALLOWED TO BURN THROUGH OUR WEBSITE AND BY CALLING THE BURN LINE AT 541-923-4633.

BURNING OF YARD DEBRIS:

- 1) The minimum required distance from a structure is 25 feet when the pile size is 3 feet or less in diameter and 2 feet or less in height, or the fire is contained in a burn barrel.
- 2) The minimum required distance from a structure shall be 50 feet where the pile size is greater than 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet in height.
- 3) **If your yard debris pile is larger than 6' x 6', you will need to call the fire station and have us come out and look at it, and will need a special permit to burn it.**

CAMPFIRES:

- 1) Campfires are prohibited when the Fire Danger Rating is extreme and during periods of Red Flag Warnings due to hazardous fire weather, or at any other time declared by the Fire Chief or his designee.
- 2) Campfires and portable fire type pits may only be ignited after sunset and extinguished before you retire for the evening.
- 3) Campfires shall not be larger than 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet in height, and shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

- 1) Failure to follow the outdoor burning regulations may result in loss of your burning privileges, and/or legal consequences through local or state agencies.
- 2) **YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR FIRE AND ANY DAMAGE THAT RESULTS FROM IT.**
- 3) All fires must be constantly attended by an adult until the fire is extinguished (cold to the touch).
- 4) The following equipment must be on site of any outdoor burning: a) shovel or rake, b) garden hose, or other water sources sufficient to extinguish the fire.
- 5) All flammable vegetation must be cleared for a minimum of 10 feet around any outdoor burning site.
- 7) A copy of this pamphlet will be required when requested by any fire or law enforcement official.
- 8) **ABSOLUTELY NO "DEBRIS" BURNING AFTER SUNSET.**

The Fire Chief or his designee is authorized to order the extinguishment of any open burning which creates, or adds to, a hazardous or objectionable situation in his/her opinion. Burning that is offensive or objectionable because of smoke or odor emissions OR when atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fires hazardous, is prohibited.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- 1) **Can my church/youth group have a big bonfire at our house? No, you may have a small campfire that is 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet in height. It must be 25 feet away from any structure.**
- 2) **I am concerned over the height of my neighbors burn pile flames and they are burning some things they are not suppose to burn, who do I call? Please call 9-1-1 and report it to Dispatch. They will inform us and we will go out to the property and investigate the size of the pile & items they are burning.**
- 3) **We just built a home and we need to clean up all the construction debris laying around the house, can we burn it? Most construction debris is pre-treated with chemicals, etc. The following materials are prohibited from being burned:**
 - Waste from commercial establishments
 - Forest slash
 - Construction and demolition debris
 - Land clearing

If your debris pile is larger than 6' x 6' it will require us to come out and look at it first before you burn it and you will need a special permit to burn it.
